New Addition - QR Code

In this month's newsletter you will notice that we've made the addition of a few QR codes. We realize that not everyone is tech savvy, but QR codes are very easy to use:

Step 1: Open up the camera app on your phone

Step 2: Hover over the QR until it turns yellow

Step 3: A link will pop up, click it - this will open the information that coincides with that code!

The conference consists of participatory workshops at the University of Wisconsin campus, speakers, tours and visits to the World Dairy Expo. Representatives can show Holstein or color breeds because both groups help sponsor the trip.

Project Documentation: Achievement Day Requirement

By now all members should have received their new binder to be used as a "4-H Portfolio" - a way of documenting their 4-H career with the goal of the Provincial Council being able to give credit to members for their time in 4-H when they graduate from high school. If you did not receive a binder from your Overall Leader please inquire with your leader. Leaders, if you need more binders, please reach out to the office. <u>Each</u> member is required to have their binder on display at Achievement Day as part of a member's project completion.

All Members must complete the following documentation. This document only need to be filled out once.

Portfolio Documentation

If you are completing an Animal Project these are the documents that you need to have

- 1. <u>Project Page: Animal Project</u> this document is required to be filled out for <u>each</u> animal project that a member completes. For instance, if a member is completing beef and canine, at Achievement Day they must have one of these forms filled out for beef and another for canine.
- 2. <u>Creed of the Animal Caretaker</u> any member completing an animal project must print and sign this document to be displayed in their binder.
- 3. <u>Judging Overview</u> any member completing an animal project must print this document and complete it accordingly

If you are completing an Home Economic or Life Skill Project these are the documents that you need to have

One of the following forms is required to be filled out for <u>each</u> home economic or life skill project that a member completes. For instance, if a member is completing sewing and cooking, at Achievement Day they must have one of these forms filled out for sewing and another for cooking

- <u>Project Page: Home Ec Project</u> this document can be used when a project has additional expenses (ie. Craft supplies, sewing materials, food, etc.)
- <u>Project Page: Life Skill Project</u> this document can be used when a project does not have documentable expenses (ie. Astronomy, outdoors, etc.)



PEI Mutual 4-H Judging Competition Results

The 24th annual PEI Mutual 4-H Judging Competition took place this year over a series of three nights in May and June. Each night of the competition the 4-H members were tasked with judging two classes of livestock and/or crops. A total of 27 members from across PEI participate in the competition.

The first night was held on May 15th at Craggan Farm in Marshfield where the members judged dairy and poultry animals. The judge for the dairy class was Bruce Wood and the judge for poultry was Trevor MacDonald. Animals were provided by that evening's generous hosts, Jill and John Wood.

The second night of the competition was held at Country Isle Stables in Kinkora on May 29. This evening the members judged both horses and silage. The judges for this leg of the competition were Taylor Matheson (equine), and Les Halliday (forages). Everyone was grateful to Lynda Ramsay and Stephen Johnston for the use of their beautiful facility and animals.

The final night of the competition was June 9th at Mutch Farms in Earnscliffe. This evening beef and rabbits were the classes the members were tasked with placing with the help of judges Jennie Mutch (beef) and Brandon Malone (rabbit). Jennie and Stephen Mutch's scenic farm made for a wonderful location for the last night of the event.

Exhibition Circuit

We know that some of our Clubs have Achievement Days coming up so here is some information for our "non-livestock members" regarding how you can be involved in Exhibitions!



What does "Exhibition Circuit" mean?

- 1. A term widely used in 4-H PEI during June, July and August
- 2. The series of events in which 4-H project items travel to during the summer for display Beginning in Alberton or Crapaud, onto Old Home Week and Dundas, then ending in Evangeline
- 3. A method of displaying the talents (project work!) of 4-H members and promoting the program

How can you participate?

A member must simply complete the project requirements for the project that they have chosen and display project items at Achievement Day. On each Project Information Page (P.I.P.) - found on the website - there is a heading **Exhibition Requirements**: here you will find what item you can send on the Exhibition Circuit. *Note - there are some projects that do not have tangible items as a project requirement; in this case you cannot send an item onto the Circuit. There are also some projects (ie. Foods) in which your items must be made fresh for each Exhibition - see below.* The 4-H Home Ec. & Life Skill Projects: Classes and sections for PEI Fairs & Exhibitions lists classes and sections with specifications for each.

Why should members participate?

First of all, you should be proud of your work and feel confident in displaying it for others to see! Exhibitions are a great opportunity for the 4-H program to showcase the work our members do. Your project items naturally become a recruitment tool; it is our hope that when others see what 4-H has to offer that they will reach out and join the program too! Did we mention there is prize money involved!? Projects are judged at each of the five Exhibitions and prize money is awarded. Members will receive prizes in the fall. Finally, exhibitions are economically and historically very important to our communities and by contributing your work you are, yet again, using your hands for larger service to better your community.

How do my project items entered?

At your Club's Achievement Day you can indicate to your Overall Leader or 4-H Specialist which item/s you are wanting to enter. Items will be gathered and delivered to the Provincial 4-H Office. Alternatively, you can deliver your own item to the 4-H Office by noon on July 26th (these items will go to Crapaud)... or each Fair has a "project drop off date" listed. Project items can be dropped off at any of these times. More specifically, if you are completing a Foods, Cake Decorating, etc. project - these will be the dates/times in which you drop off your baked goods.
