







4-H CANADA IS GOING GLOBAL and will be hosting a new travel opportunity in June 2017!

The Global 4-H Summit will be an opportunity for youth, leaders and delegations from 70 countries around the world, representing 7 million youth worldwide, to gather in Ottawa while celebrations are underway for Canada's 150th birthday.

NEW: This special event will incorporate the **National Leadership Summit** and the **National** Members Forum for 2017. Due to the special nature of programming in 2017, PEI will be able to send 10 youth and 12 adults to the Global Summit. The cost of the program (including travel, meals and accommodation) will be \$800 per delegate (with a possible subsidy program — to be confirmed). Deadline for applications is September 15. Old Home Week 2016




4-H PEI will once again have a strong presence at Old Home Week this year, from August 11th - 20th. In an effort to further promote the 4-H program and recruit new members & volunteer leaders the "4-H Drop-In Centre" has been renamed the 4-H Exploration Centre!

The 4-H Exploration Centre will be open from 12:00pm until 9:00pm daily and staffed by 4-H members who will guide visitors through displays of members'

promoting rural safety awareness for all ages.

Another new initiative this year will be our collaboration with the PEI Women's **Institute** where handicraft demonstrations and associated "learn to do by doing" activities in both the Exploration Centre and upstairs in the Women's Institute section of the building. The schedule and list of activities will be released with 2016 Old Home Week publications.





2016 Judging Competition at 4-H Day

For the second year, the 4-H PEI member Judging Competition will be a part of 4-H Day at Old Home Week on Wednesday, August 17th. The competition will begin in the Main Ring, following the 4-H livestock classes. Members who register to participate will be asked to judge: four classes of livestock, three classes of home economic projects and a mystery class! This activity is open to 4-H members province wide regardless of whether or not you have experience with livestock as it's meant to be a fun learning experience, so we don't expect anyone to be an expert judge!



Pizza will be served following the competition. There will be cash prizes for the winners in each category, as well as a prize for the highest club participation. Finally, the top senior 4-H member (age 17-21 years old) will be chosen to represent PEI in the Canadian National 4-H & Youth Judging Competition at Agribition - an event held annually in Regina, SK. How will we sustainably feed over 9 billion people by the year 2050?

Journey 2050 is an interactive online game offered to 4-H members through a partnership between 4-H Canada and Agrium which allows youth to explore world food sustainability and see how our decisions impact social, economic and environmental factors locally and globally as we strive to feed a growing population.

2050 is a key moment in time - the world's population will be 9 billion. Food production needs are expected to rise by 60% and changing agronomic conditions will put pressure on agriculture yields.

Journey 2050 is an agriculture education program that challenges participants to answer the question "How will we sustainably feed 9 billion people by the year 2050?"

The players experience the lives of three farm families in Kenya, India, and Canada. As the player interacts with each family they learn the role of best management practices in feeding the world, reducing environmental impacts and in improving social performance through greater access to education, medical care and community infrastructure. Our Journey to feeding the world has started.









4-H Mpact on Youth Survey Share your voice and have your say! May 1st - September 30th

In partnership with the **Positive Youth Development Lab at Carleton University**, 4-H Canada has begun a study to measure the impact of the 4-H program on youth members. Members across Canada are being encouraged to complete the 4-H Impact on Youth Survey and share their 4-H experiences as a part of this important research.

We want to know how 4-H has shaped you! To complete the survey member families can either go online to the 4-H Canada website (4-h-canada.ca) or the ask your 4-H Specialist for a paper copy of the survey. The survey is anonymous and confidential. Participants who complete the survey will automatically receive 10% off at the 4-H Canada online store!

It's anticipated that results from the data collected will help illustrate the effectiveness of the 4-H program, and its positive impact on youth across Canada as a way of attracting and retaining funders, stakeholders and new 4-H families and leaders. This survey will help youth share their thoughts, needs and why 4-H is relevant to them. The final report will also include province-specific data that will help provinces see the needs, gaps, successes and opportunities identified by provincial members. Just a few reasons why participation in the survey is so important. We hope you think so too and that your family chooses to complete the survey—with our thanks!



celebrate everything we love about 4-H on PEI!

This year's Rural Youth Fair will be held in **Alberton at the Prince County Exhibition Grounds**, with West Prince taking on the role of "Host District." The event will kick-off with a delicious homemade breakfast served by the members and leaders of the **Ellerslie 4-H Club**. Lunch will be prepared by members and leaders from the **Elmsdale 4-H Club** with a menu including: hotdogs, sausages, corn-on-the cob and chili. In support of our theme "Keeping it Local!" you can be sure that, as much as possible, the food being served will be

from a local source! We are also excited to have the "Cavendish Fry Truck" return to RYF this year - the **O'Leary Explorers Club** will be serving fries and canteen items from 11am until 3pm.

The majority of the day revolves around livestock classes including: Poultry, Turkey, Rabbit, Goat, Sheep, Canine, Beef, Dairy, and Horse and Pony. In order to be eligible to compete at the Fair, members must have completed all of their project requirements, and have submitted their Exhibition Animal Entry Form by the deadline date. All submitted Life-Skill and Home Economic projects will also be on display - and will be judged for the final time at this will be the last-stop on the 2016 exhibition circuit.

A highlight of the day is the selection of the Royal Beef and Dairy Teams. 4-H PEI members (ages 13-21) who have successfully completed their Beef or Dairy project for the year (see Exhibition Book for criteria) will be eligible to compete for a chance to be on one of the teams. Those selected represent PEI at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto, a prestigious and internationally recognized event. The 4-H PEI Beef Team will compete in the National Junior Beef Heifer Show, while the 4-H PEI Dairy Team will compete in the TD Canadian 4-H Dairy Classic.

The **Skills Competition** (schedule pending) is open to both 4-H members and non 4-H members to participate in these hands-on, skill-testing events with cash prizes. Fun (and free!) activities such as Bubble Soccer, Archery Tag, Face Painting and activity tables will also be offered to everyone attending (including guests!) throughout the day.

Don't forget to stop by the Welcome Table to fill out a ballot for a chance to win our Grand Prize of a one night's stay at the Delta Prince Edward in Charlottetown. "Buddy Bags" will be available again this year for families who are interested in learning more about joining 4-H, so be sure to tell your friends!




