EXHIBITION CIRCUIT

Member's are invited to enter their project (s) for judging at the first Exhibition of the season (either Alberton or Crapaud). Members are then welcome to send projects (excluding foods, decorated cakes or large, heavy items) on the Exhibition Circuit which will see the transportation of projects to/from each exhibition, with set-up & management provided by the 4-H PEI Exhibition Specialist, Summer Assistants and Volunteers.

MEMBERS WILL SUBMIT PROJECTS THE CIRCUIT AT THEIR OWN RISK.

4-H PEI will take great care in transporting and displaying 4-H projects, but will not be held responsible for those projects that become dirtied, wrinkled, damaged or lost as a result of being part of the Circuit.



4-H PEI Home Ec. & Life Skill Projects

Guidelines for classes at PEI Fairs & Exhibitions

- 1. Only 4-H PEI members are eligible to compete in 4-H classes at PEI Fairs & Exhibitions.
- 2. The items required for a specific class/section are listed in the **Home Ec. & Life Skill Classes & Sections**. If the item entered is not the required item for the class/section or does not meet all specifications (i.e. size), it will be disqualified.
- 3. Judges are chosen for their expertise in any given area. The perspective of one judge may differ from another and the judge reserves the right to place a class as they see fit. Therefore, results may differ from Exhibition to Exhibition.
- 4. 4-H entries must be from the current 4-H year project work and must have been received completion at the member's Achievement Day

(NOTE: The deadline for Achievement Days is July 23)

- 5. Each item submitted for judging must have an 4-H exhibition tag. Exhibition tags are available at any of the Provincial 4-H Offices or from your 4-H Specialist. Tags are to be filled out and securely fastened to the item entered for judging. The tags are meant to remain attached to individual items for the exhibition season and will only be replaced by 4-H Staff if necessary.
 - Please do not remove any exhibition tags or ribbons that may be attached to exhibition tags.
- 6. Special ribbons will be awarded to Exploring 4-H and Cloverbud items, REAL Skills and Junior Leadership books. These projects will not be judged in competition, but are welcome for display on the Exhibition circuit.

 Please do not remove special ribbons between exhibitions.
- 7. The first & second place items in each SECTION of the Junior & Senior CLASSES will be placed in a separate "Champion Class" and judged for Champion prizes. Where there is no age breakdown for a CLASS, the first & second place items from each SECTION will be placed in a separate "Champion Class" and judged.
- 8. Any prize money and/or ribbons awarded in the **Home Ec. & Life Skill 4-H Classes** will be mailed to the recipient's overall leader in the fall (usually in October).

2. CAKE DECORATING I

Members shall exhibit ONE (1) 6" round or square cake, decorated with butter cream icing

*Cake must be decorated with 3 different decorating tips showing the tip and border of each

3. CAKE DECORATING II

Members shall exhibit ONE (1) 6" round or square cake, decorated with butter cream icing.

*Cake must display a rose or sweet pea arrangement (including leaves) and at least 1 of the borders learned in Cake Decorating I



**Cakes will be judge based on decorating alone. Therefore, members are encouraged to use a re-usable foam cake form vs a baked cake as the decorating must be freshly done for each exhibition. A re-usable form will eliminate the waste of a baked cake

**Drop off and pick-up of decorated cakes for judging is the responsibility of the member. Decorated cakes will NOT be transported on the Exhibition Circuit)

4. PAINTING (Canvas Artwork or Paint Book)

- -Members completing "Do Your Own Thing" or a "Create-A-Project" focusing on painting shall exhibit ONE (1) entry of painted art work in this section
- -Painted work shall be displayed on Canvas or in a Paint Book
- -Painting mediums shall include (but are not limited to) water colour, oil, acrylic, etc.

5. DRAWING (Canvas Artwork or Sketch Book)

- -Members completing "Do Your Own Thing" or a "Create-A-Project" focusing on Drawing or Sketching shall exhibit ONE (1) entry of drawn or sketched art work in this section.
- -Work shall be displayed on Canvas or in a Sketch Book.
- -Mediums shall include (but are not limited to) pencil, pen, pastels, charcoal, etc.



6. **OTHER**

The total scores from the three (3) types of vegetables will determine the placings

Members are asked to have the following requirements present for project completion:

- Pest Control Plan (displayed in a folder with pictures)
- Garden Plan
- Weed Collection
- Three (3) types of vegetables these will also be judged against other 4-H gardening projects at the fair

Leader inspection checkmarks must be submitted to the 4-H PEI Office

2. FLORICULTURE

The exhibition item for the **Floriculture Project** will be a flower arrangement. (Members are asked to refer to the Project Guide for the arrangement requirements)

Members are asked to have the following requirements present for project completion:

- Fresh flower arrangement
- Report on special project
- A garden plan
- Flower box/container (see note below)

 JUNIOR members (ages 9-14) will grow and exhibit 3 5 types of flowers (annuals, biennials, or perennials)

 SENIOR members (ages 15-21) will grow 4 6 types.

3. **POTATO** (age 9 - 21)

The exhibition item for the Potato Project will be three (3) potatoes of two (2) varieties

Members are asked to have the following requirements present at RYF for project completion:

- Judging Mark
- Report on special project
- Report or Confirmation of Tour
- Potatoes (3 potatoes 2 varieties)
