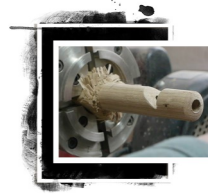

### Central Region - Communications Scholarship Award

The Communications Project serves to support 4-H members in:

- developing skills related to the preparation & presentation of 4-H speeches and/or demonstrations
- building of self confidence while learning how to express thoughts in public settings
- completing one of the four requirements mandatory for finishing the 4-H year

Recognizing the hard work and commitment that goes into preparing and presenting a speech or demonstration, the Council has determined that members deserved to be further acknowledged for their efforts and celebrated for their achievements.

In 2019, the council established the **Communications Scholarship Award**. This is to be presented as an annual scholarship to the Top Senior Presenter in either public speaking or demonstrations at Central 4-H Region Communications. Recipients receive acknowledgement of this achievement and are then awarded the scholarship, in the amount of \$500, with their proof of enrolment in post-secondary education. The award is available to any senior member chosen at club/area level to compete at Regional Communications.

The Central Region 4-H Council is pleased to announce that the scholarship has since been awarded consecutively in 2021 and 2022 and will be presented again at the 2023 Regional Communications! Congratulations to Davis Nicholson of the Cavendish 4-H Club who was the recipient of this scholarship in both 2021 and 2022. We look forward to presenting this again to the next Top Senior Presenter at Central Region Communications (Spring 2023)
